James: A Maturing Faith Works, But God Gives More Grace

READ JAMES: Please take the time to read the entire letter in one sitting and then dedicate the next week or two to reread it slowly and consider how can grow as a doer of the Word.

JAMES OR JACOB: THE AUTHOR?

- Who is the author of this letter? In the first verse he introduces himself as James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - o The Greek and Hebrew translation of his name:
 - Greek Jakobos Jacob
 - Jewish Ya'akov Jacob
 - Latin lacomus -- James
 - O Why the change and emphasis?
 - There are many theories, but we can see a shift in the 13th & 14th translations of the Bible by John Wycliffe. He stuck with James and then after 1611, King James authorized his version of the Bible. I'm sure he liked the name.
 - Most scholars believe that James (Jacob) is the half Brother of Jesus and he was named after his Grandfather (Matt. 1:16) and Patriarch.

JAMES: THE LETTER

- James is considered to be the most distinctly Jewish letter in the New Testament.
- James was the leader of the Church in Jerusalem and he wrote this letter to Jewish Christians (12 Tribes) in the Dispersion.
 - Diaspora: scattered throughout the world ... Like seed sown in a field.

- Double Diaspora: As Jews in Roman Empire and Christians who placed their faith in the Messiah.
- James was definitely influenced by Jesus' teaching as he echoes many themes from the Sermon on the Mount and the Proverbs with short pithy and observational wisdom.
- Of the 108 verses, 59 are imperatives.
 - Clear James wants Christians to grow in maturity and faith and to practice wise commands and live perfect lives.

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JAMES – THEME & PURPOSE

- 1:26-27. If you think you are Religious...
 - Bridle your tongue
 - o Visit and care for orphans and widows in their affliction
 - Keep yourself unstained from the world
 - If you can, then your Religion (faith) is pure
 - If you can't, then your religion is worthless.
- James goes on from there to expose just how worthless our faith is in our own strength and merit.
- 4:6-8. "BUT He (God) gives more GRACE."
 - o God Opposes the Proud ... so
 - Submit to God's Authority
 - Resist the Devil (sin, evil & self)
 - Draw near to God → He will draw near to you
 - Cleanse your Hands
 - Purify your Heart and Mind
 - Humble Yourself before the Lord → He will exalt you
 - Speak no evil against one another

LESSONS FROM JAMES

- CHAPTER 1 (1:19-25)
 - o Be Doers of the Word. Not just hears of the Word.

- CHAPTER 2 (2:1-13)
 - Favoritism & Partiality is a denial of our Oneness in Christ and a reflection of our arrogant selfish depravity.
 - In light of our world today, what is the Holy Spirt teaching you?

(2:14-26)

- Faith that produces nothing is like a body without breath. Faith without works is Dead.
 - Your Faith leads to salvation
 - While your Works reveal the genuineness of your faith and salvation

- CHAPTER 3 (3:1-12)
 - The Tongue is a small and uncontrollable force for good and evil.

- Bridle & Bit
- Rudder of a ship
- Fire
- Cursing & Blessing

- CHAPTER 4 (4:1-12)
 - Our fondness of and with the world reveals our rebellious, offensive and adulterous heart towards God.
 - o But God gives more Grace. Amazing!
 - Spend some time in reflection God's Grace given to you.

- CHAPTER 5 (5:1-20)
 - (11) In every life circumstance (wealth, health, trials, suffering, etc.), remain steadfast for the Lord is compassionate and merciful.
 - o (16) Confess your sin. Pray with great power.
