

Dear Western Springs Baptist Church,

There is a story about a monastery in Europe perched high on a cliff several hundred feet in the air. The only way to reach the monastery was to be suspended in a basket which was pulled to the top by several monks who pulled and tugged with all their strength. Obviously, the ride up the steep cliff in that basket was terrifying.

One tourist got exceedingly nervous about halfway up as he noticed that the rope by which he was suspended was old and frayed. With a trembling voice he asked the monk who was riding with him in the basket how often they changed the rope. The monk thought for a moment and answered brusquely, "Whenever it breaks."

This is possibly how you are feeling on this COVID-19 journey. It is disconcerting to be on a journey that seems so strange and precarious. Will we make it to the top? Are the supports of our lives strong enough to last until things get back to normal – whatever that is? Do you sense that your ropes of support are old and frayed? Let me suggest that now may be the time to change the rope.

Isaiah writes, "He (the Everlasting God) gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint" (Isaiah 40:29-31).

There is the answer. A renewed hope in our strong Lord gives us a renewed strength for the rest of the journey. Hope for the Christian is our expectation for the future based on the nature and character of God. We must regularly renew our strength by renewing our focus on a loving, faithful God and a Savior who provides for us. He promises that he will be with us "always, to the very end of the age." Our example is the Psalmist in Psalm 42. He looks around and his soul is downcast, disturbed, frayed and worn, and then sings this refrain: "Put your hope in God, for I will yet praise him, my Savior and my God."

Let me urge you to spend time with God in these days when things seem a little bit frayed. Replace the rope of his strength in your life. Put your hope in God. Then you will soar like eagles, run and not get weary, and walk and not be faint. Be assured that I will be praying for you as we continue this strange journey.

### Jean and Joy Thomas

My heart has been laid heavy by the situations happening in my home country of Haiti and the United States (my place of residence). In Haiti, 59% of the population live on less than two dollars a day (even less in most rural communities). This isn't even due to COVID-19; this has been an ongoing fact for a very long time. Haiti is the poorest country in the western hemisphere, the sixth poorest in the world, and lies only 700 miles off the coast of Miami. The effects of COVID-19 are deteriorating an already egregious situation. There are hundreds of new cases everyday; even with very limited testing, and famine is being brought on by low imports of aid, goods, and food.

There are about 70,000 people who live in Fond des Blancs, and Haiti Christian Development Fund has been working hard with the community to bring about a brighter, more self-sustaining and prosperous future. There are no ands, ors, or ifs about it, I love and appreciate our donors and supporters like Charlotte Craig, Dave and Judy Wagner, Dixie Noble, and so many more who truly believe in what we are doing and want to see reconciliation live out in its fullest in Fond des Blancs, see a community rise to self-sufficiency, and become an example for other communities.

We, however, need more supporters and donors and we need everyone's help. Famine has been a mainstay in Haiti, which has been caused by many external and internal historical factors, but it is getting worse due to COVID-19 and severe droughts. Right now, our Jubilee Farm is the only farm with growing crops. Every other farmer's crops in the surrounding community and beyond are dead or dying.

Good news is we have raised \$185,000 but we still need over \$75,000 to cover the cost of purchasing 130 acres of farmland currently farmed as part of the co-op with local landowners. Purchasing this land will help us make real significant land improvements and increase each crop's yield.

over 50 people across three continents. It's a whirlwind of presentations, discussions, and



celebration of what God is doing through the software we develop and support.

COVID-19 couldn't stop us from sharing an update with churches about our

Wycliffe ministry – we took our sharing online with Mission Moment Zooms.

Our children had never experienced springtime before this trip. We all watched in amazement as the snow and cold gave way to buds on trees and green popping up everywhere. It was wonderful to witness God's creation come alive.

My very first *KitchenAid* stand mixer was a gift from my mother while I was in my fellowship at UC-Irvine. It sat on my kitchen counter collecting dust for well over a year-and-a-half. But when I finally used it for the first time, I couldn't understand how I had lived without this amazing invention all my life. It's an essential for any serious baker. This summer, my mixer gave out and I was forced to purchase a new one. It took me a few minutes to figure out how to connect the various attachments that came with the new mixer before I could use it. But one thing I didn't have to figure out was that the mixer had to be plugged into a power source in order to work. Unplugged, it was of little use. There was nothing wrong with it—it just needed power. As I was making the first batch of chocolate chip cookies with my new mixer, I thought to myself: that's exactly how it is with the children of God. If you are a Christian, you already have the Holy Spirit. But just like that mixer, you have to be plugged in to your power source to be able to harness his power.

The same power that raised Jesus from the dead now lives in you. The better we know the Holy Spirit, the more we can be empowered by him. Wherever you need the power of God today, the Spirit is the answer to your need.

Walking through the book of Acts, we see the power of God at work on every hand. Three thousand are saved at Pentecost; a crippled man is healed; fearful disciples are now preaching boldly to the Sanhedrin; Saul of Tarsus is converted; thousands come to Christ through Paul's ministry. It's miracle upon miracle.

Can God really do today what he did then? Can we have the same power in our lives that they had in theirs? The answer is absolutely YES! But we must be filled with the Spirit and submit to his control. The book of Acts provides us with biblical, practical steps to the abundant life of Christ.

We want to extend a special invitation to each woman at WSBC to join ***Women's Life*** as we begin our fourth year this coming fall. We will be studying the book of Acts using Max Lucado's *Life Lessons from Acts*. This is a 10-week study which begins Thursday, September 10 from 9-11AM.
