



Africa Initiative

Psalm 46 has been so real to us in dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic that has been ravaging the world in these past few months. We sympathize with those of you who lost loved ones, your jobs and businesses, or have been impacted in one way or another by this virus.

As many of you have also experieced, we were practically confined to our home since March 2020 as the government locked down the country in an attempt to stem the spread of the Coronavirus.

If there is an upside to the lockdown, it is that we were able to spend quality time with our children helping them spiritually, physically, socially, and educationally. It has been a very special time of family bonding.

Also, we found that many people who were hitherto hostile are now very open to the gospel as they seek to understand the meaning of life in view of the current global chaos. Josiah has had opportunity to address these issues at several online events organized by our local church in Lagos in the past few months.

Please stay safe and healthy and let us know if there are specific ways we can be praying for you as well.

Congo Initiative

In September 2005, Congo Initiative was officially launched as a non-profit dedicated to supporting Christian higher education, leadership formation, and community transformation in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). Over the past 15 years, we've invested in the future leaders of Congo and grassroots initiatives committed to hope, peace, and justice. At times, our community faced (and continues to face) what feels like insurmountable challenges: insecurity, conflict, political instability, economic hardship, and virus outbreaks. Yet, God's faithfulness and the bravery, passion, and hope of our staff and YOU, our supporters, remained united and committed to the transformation of lives and a flourishing Congo.

Locally in Costa Rica, we have been in some version of quarantine since March and now four months later, cases are quickly rising with no end in sight. We

continue to find creative ways to enter into genuine friendships with at-risk teenagers, university students, and teen moms in order to share with them hope and truth in the midst of darkness and isolation.

Here is one of several unique events that happened in Costa Rica during the past few months: virtual follow-up camp with 117 campers who had the opportunity to learn what it means to go deeper in their relationship with Jesus.

In August we celebrated five years in Costa Rica. We are incredibly thankful for God's gracious provision through the generosity of wonderful faithful supporters who have sustained us until this point. However, COVID-19 has negatively impacted our financial situation. We have reached a critical point in our funding and do not currently have sufficient funds to meet our monthly ministry expenses. Would you consider praying about ways you can join us or by connecting us with others who could become partners on this journey?

We just celebrated our one-year anniversary in Asia. It has been a challenging but very rich season for us, stretching us and forcing us to grow in ways we had never experienced before. We were quite discouraged in the fall when the jobs that originally brought us here did not end up providing us the legal pathway to stay here. But where we ended up is far better for our family and has allowed us to utilize our gifts and backgrounds better. Matt is serving as the pastor of our (currently online only) international church and continuing to teach as opportunities arise. Tia is getting her private lactation consulting business up and running, and the kids are working hard in homeschool and adjusting to life here.

While we are grateful for the technology to communicate remotely (particularly the technology that allowed Matt to defend his dissertation remotely), we dearly miss seeing all of you in person.

The travel restrictions have also made it critical to have stable visas. In May, we applied to and received permission to request a special start up business visa for one year. Tia and Matt received these visas, but the children did not. This was a surprise for everyone-even the local visa officers were confused. No one had noticed that since entrepreneurs here are usually young and don't have families, provisions for children of entrepreneurs were not written into this policy. Fortunately, by the end of May, a sympathetic visa officer pulled some strings and got the kids visas for six months. We have not heard of that happening before, and it was a major answer to prayer. We are continuing to apply for a regular work visa for Tia through her business in order for us all to stay here past November, so please pray that this application would soon have a successful outcome.

We are very thankful for technology that enables us to continue to work from home.

The Seraq literacy team is making progress on the second edition of the dictionary which they plan to publish digitally next month.

In our recent wellness checkup, something showed up in one of R's scans. More detailed scans revealed a growth in the back of her stomach. The working diagnosis is GIST (Gastro Intestinal Stromal Tumor) and the recommended treatment is to remove the growth surgically. We are thankful that this was discovered at a routine checkup since R is symptom free.

Thank you so much for your prayer before, during, and after the surgery. God graciously answered your prayers on my behalf.

The surgeon performed a GIST resection and a pyloroplasty. He sent the specimen for biopsy, and we just got the report today that there is no mitosis.

I am thankful for very helpful and skilled nurses, nurturing me to recovery. They are like angels in PPE.

At the end of July we held English Camp that was quite different this year because there was very little English there, due to the obvious reasons we could not have the American team come this year. We were praying how to go about it and we decided to hold the camp anyway with a different program. We were pleased to see that some of our non-Christian friends decided to come. We had about 55 come—about one-third of those do not belong to church.

The program included: morning Bible readings, evening programs, morning worship, seminars, afternoon elective discussions, and informal conversations.

Please pray that campers will remember conversations and ultimately accept Jesus.

Younglife Metro Southwest

We admit that we don't know exactly what Young Life will look like this fall. We're taking it one day at a time, talking to various people, working through safety protocols, and carefully crafting a plan.

But, as we have reflected on how to do ministry in the midst of a pandemic, one change has become increasingly clear: our role this year is to move away from directing programs and toward pastoring individual kids and volunteers.

We will be spending time in smaller groups and individually—listening, comforting, and guiding kids through a chaotic season of life while sharing God's love with them.

One at a time our hope is to be there for as many of them as we can. Ministry won't be the same this year, but we are hopeful that God will use this pandemic to impact kids in an entirely new way.
