I am wondering if Thanksgiving may be a little hard this year. Some of us may not be able to travel and gather with extended family as we have other years. This is added to so much else that we have lost during this pandemic year. Loss will lead to sadness if we dwell on it. But as believers in Christ we can choose to focus on the many blessings God has given us even during these days. Let me recommend that we deliberately engage in this "highest form of thought" because it is good for our souls. We probably need Thanksgiving this year more than ever.

Thanksgiving is about God the giver. That is the focus of the psalmist in Psalm 65 as he responds to God's bounty with praise and joyful thanks. He wonders at God's abundant generosity. His sense of wonder becomes the source of the psalmist's joy. It can be ours as well as we look at Psalm 65 together.

The Psalmist wonders at God's presence

God chooses to bring us near. "Blessed are those you choose and bring near to live in your courts!" In his presence "we are filled with good things." He answers our prayer; he forgives our sin; he fills us with the blessings of his grace. When we live in his presence we live in the riches of his grace that has been lavished upon us. When we think about this our happiness is doubled by the wonder of his love. *Lord, thank you for your redeeming grace*.

The Psalmist wonders at God's deeds

God's awesome and righteous deeds call for songs of joyful praise. When we think about them, we stand in awe of God's power; we wonder at his sacrifice. His work for us through Christ gives us hope that those without the Savior cannot understand. "The whole earth is filled with awe at your wonders; where morning dawns, where evening fades, you call forth songs of joy." W. H. Auden wrote: "The most commonplace things are tinged with glory." When we think about this our happiness is doubled by the wonder of his righteous works. *Lord, thank you for your majestic goodness.*

The Psalmist wonders at God's abundance

The land itself shouts for joy and sings. "You care for the land and water it; you enrich it abundantly." "The streams of God are filled with water...". "You crown the year with your bounty and your carts overflow with abundance." Bounty, abundance, overflowing blessing –God is the provider of a plentiful harvest. He is the giver of every good and perfect gift.

When we think about this, our happiness is doubled by the wonder of His abundant goodness. *Lord, thank you for your bountiful care.*

This Thanksgiving season let's deliberately join together in this highest form of thought. Gratitude focuses on God and delights in who he is and what he has done for us. Breakthrough Urban Ministries



Breakthrough and outreach organizations across Chicago are offering free legal aid through the

Justice Corps community lawyer program, a project of Communities Partnership 4 Peace and Metropolitan Family Services.

"Nine times out of ten somebody is fighting a case already, and they are wondering if they can get support" said Damien Morris, director of Breakthrough's Violence Prevention Initiative. "So when we do street outreach, we can tell them, not only will we go to court with you, but also we have a resource where we can refer you to this legal team to go over your case."

This past month we have seen the truth of Romans 8:28 once more, that God can make all things work together for the good of those that love him. In mid-august, Arno and Sahar's youngest daughter had emergency surgery to remove a severely infected tooth.

One of their doctors overheard Sahar comforting her daughter in a foreign language. When she learned that Sahar was from Iran, she told her she had to meet her boss, a lead pediatrician at the hospital, who is an Iranian woman. After meeting Sahar and hearing about our work, she eagerly volunteered to help. We brought her our first case the following week.

One couple, believers from Iran, has a young son we have long perceived to have some kind of developmental delay. Considering the language barrier and the need for a local pediatrician to communicate directly with the child in such a case, we felt unable to proceed. After her initial exam, this Iranian doctor immediately approached the other necessary specialists in the hospital and convinced them to volunteer their time to help diagnose this boy. Together, they are assembling a proposal to request that the hospital also offer their services, tests and imaging for free or at a greatly reduced price. Praise God for this answer to prayer for this family and continue to pray for them that they might obtain a clear diagnosis and clear direction for future treatment and therapy.

This fall God is opening doors for us to serve families in our communities in new ways. In just a few days, we'll be resuming our weekly Teen Night Together (TNT) program for our middle school and high school teens. TNT provides recreation time, dinner, a Bible lesson, a College and Career Readiness session, and a great time for teens to connect with others in person while maintaining safe social distancing practices on our campus. We are excited to welcome the teens back to our campus for the fall and winter season.

Thank you for your continued support to make this ministry possible – God is doing great things in the midst of this challenging time.

Haiti Christian Development Fund (HCDF)

Thank you to everyone who participated and donated during our Farm fundraiser. Thanks to everyone's support and generosity, we were able to purchase the land. This journey is not over however. I will be updating you on any improvements we do on the farmland and how you can help.



Praise God, COVID-19 has not struck Fond des Blancs. We continue to take precautions, especially as we try to open school back up. We are the only school in the surrounding area that requires masks and thankfully all the students are doing a good job of keeping them on throughout the day. At church we continue to social distance, take temperatures, and require masks.

We wish we could provide more options to our community through remote learning and church. Sadly, as many of you know, Internet is one of the necessities Fond des Blancs and most of Haiti are in desperate need of.

Did you know that education and poverty are directly linked? Lack of access to education is a major predictor of passing poverty from one generation to the next. Education curbs the effects of communicable diseases that can plague poverty-stricken areas. It helps create gender equality. By educating girls and boys, you provide them with the ability to make their own decisions. Education creates development, free-thinking citizens, and better health and wellbeing. A good education can provide a lifetime of opportunities. Providing an education allows people living in poverty to think outside of wondering when the next meal might be. Providing an education for the poverty-stricken allows them to provide for themselves in the future.

I write this update exactly two months after R wrote her first post-surgery update, and one week after my own surgery. I am recovering well from a robotic prostatectomy. I was able to get an

appointment with the most experienced urological surgeon in the country, Dr Loh CS and my surgery was performed just a week later. Dr Loh is in the same room



with the patient but sits at a VR workstation connected to the Da Vinci four-armed robot to perform incredibly precise surgeries.

We have so much for which to praise God: that the cancer was found relatively early, that the best doctor in the country was able to accommodate me, that the COVID-19 situation here has been largely under control, and for a place to stay in Kuala Lumpur.

This has been quite an eventful couple of months: two cancer surgeries and the

passing of my father, on top of everything else going on in the world. We are so, so grateful for the strong support we have felt from family, friends, and colleagues. I can't imagine facing all these things without your love and support.

Every day they were supposed to use the last remaining oil and flour and every day the Lord would supply enough for the next day. Over the last six months, I feel like God has been teaching me to rely on him daily. Each day I am to come to him, with no plans, nothing that I am holding on to, just open palms releasing my wants and desires to him, daily depending on the Lord.

Certainly, the first couple of months I was kicking and screaming about all of my cancelled plans, but as time went on, our family started to shift to daily plans and began to pray specifically for things for that day or the next. As months went on, we looked back and saw God answering our daily prayers in amazing ways.

Over the last six months we were able to start Young Life ministry in both Moline, IL and Bettendorf, IA. This is so exciting as we seek to reach more students with the gospel. We are currently praying and working to develop ministry in: Decatur, IL and in IA: Orange City, Waukee, Urbandale, and Clear Lake. Join us as we pray and ask the Lord to lead us. <u>NOTE: please join the</u> <u>Missions Committee as we pray specifically</u> for the Clear Lake Region. In August, I (Liz) finished going through



the Young*Lives* Mentor Training Handbook with three women. We are now ready to start meeting with teen moms when God brings them our

way. We all have been reaching out to local ministries and organizations around Des Moines and are hoping to partner with an organization that is already working with teen moms. We are encouraged as things are moving forward and are continuing to pray for God's timing and God's leading.

Please pray for God to bring more women for mentors and teen moms who are open to mentoring.
