writes:

My parents served the community of Fond-des-Blancs for forty years, bringing holistic ministry through community development programs. As they now transition to new roles and new passions, please allow me to reflect on how their lives have impacted countless people in Fond-des-Blancs.

Jesus served and lived amongst the

poor, and through his teaching we envision the path to reconciliation is communing with prisoners, the sick, the oppressed, and the poor. My parents chose this path and have followed it for most of their lives. Jean and Joy started programs to positively serve the Fond-des-Blancs community: Pre-K through high school, a credit union, various road projects, reforestation projects, leadership programs, and numerous others that have a lasting and sustainable impact on Fond-des-Blancs and surrounding communities. Many of these programs are still thriving and are being led by local leaders which creates a strong foundation for growth and reconciliation for years to come.

Jean and Joy now have a beautiful home by the sea. They moved to Dariol, a community one-and-a-half hours away from their previous home in Dugue. Their hope is to provide space for the new generation of community leaders so they will flourish and grow into the ambassadors the community needs. There is no doubt, however, that by their presence in Dariol, and by the natural servitude in their hearts, their new community will be impacted for the better.

Jean and Joy are well and healthy. By the grace of God, they will continue to live and prosper for many more years, but they will need your continued prayers. The relationship between Jean and Joy with WSBC is a cherished one and it has produced much fruit for the community of Fonddes-Blancs. I praise God for this relationship and for your faithful and generous giving to HCDF. Serving is beautiful and nourishing work, and I undoubtably know that their hearts will lead them to serve the people of Dariol.
